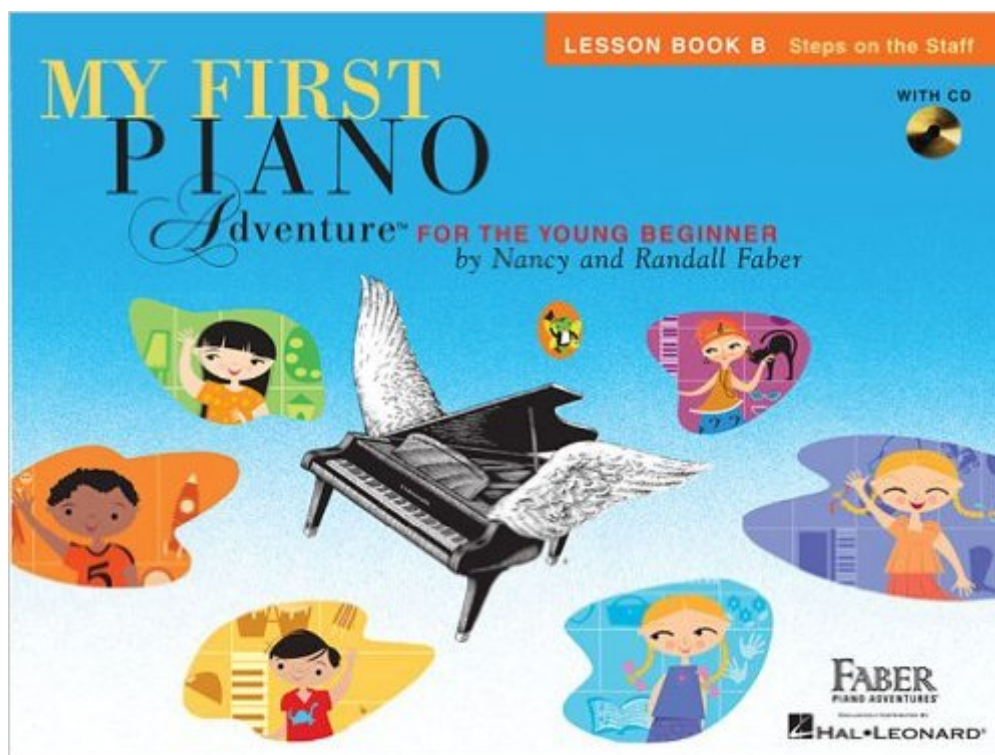

My First Piano Adventure, Lesson Book B With CD



Synopsis

(Faber Piano Adventures). Book B of the Fabers' method for the young beginner moves the student into staff-reading. Music notation is explored through stepwise directional reading, pattern recognition, and changing hand positions, all in the context of engaging songs, games and creative exploration at the piano. Maintaining the child-centered philosophy of the series, the "friends at the piano" from the A Books introduce students to the music of two new composer friends Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and Ludwig van Beethoven. Classic themes share the stage with contemporary pop and jazz sounds for young ears to absorb and enjoy. The Book B CD presents a vibrant mix of sounds, from boogie to Beethoven. It serves as a listening CD which educates and as an accompaniment CD for play-along.

I love this series of piano books! I'm teaching my daughter piano and as an experienced pianist myself I can say I would have loved to learn using the Faber method. They incorporate all the parts of playing the piano--not just learning notes and theory, but also composition, sight-reading, and ear training. The CDs are incredibly well done and all of my kids love listening to them. I honestly don't think I'd be successful in teaching my own child without this system.

I have been teaching piano lessons for over twenty years now and the Faber and Faber method has been my favorite since college. I love how thorough the Faber's are, covering everything from

technique to ear training, sight reading, theory, and artistry. My students are never disappointed by the song selection and the duets are the best I've heard from any method series. Highly, highly recommended.

The book is a wonderful beginners piano book continuation of the A books. It introduces the theory of the piano notes on a scale at a very gentle pace so that the beginner is not overwhelmed. My daughter enjoys it.

My 4 year old is learning a lot from this book and its companion writing book. I heard her tell her teacher that Beethoven was a "great composer" the other day. The CD helps the kids learn the sounds of the music before they learn to play it. We started with the "pre-reading" series of these books, but this made a great start to learning to read music on the grand staff. Be careful, the CD (and lesson) songs are catchy. I regularly get them stuck in my head!

We purchased books in this series for my 10 year old daughter and while they are well written, she lost interest in practicing. The ones with the CD's are better since she can play them even when dad isn't around to help. I wish they had DVDs to be the "music instructor".

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
