

The book and it's content were informative and enlightening. This review is not about the book, but the reader. I nearly stopped listening so many times because of the inaccuracies and mispronunciations of the reader. How could Audible have let this happen? There were so many, but some of the most glaring were: the German word "du," pianoforte, Cherubini. The movements of the mass, for example "sanctus." Fortunately, this did not go through the entire book, as the words listed previously did. Finally, anyone seeing I-V in a book about music and compositions, and not knowing those are Roman numerals representing tonic and dominant, therefore pronouncing them as if they were letters, should not be reading a book about music. My only conclusion is that the reader didn't care enough about his subject to do some very basic study, and that no one at Audible

listened to what was being recorded. I endured to the end because I cared about the subject. But, if you are a person who knows anything about music, I would suggest you get the book and not listen to the audio. My recommendation to Audible would be to record another version with another reader.
